# 2008 ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) REPORT 

Board of Education Briefing
San Diego Unified School District
December 9, 2008

## Introduction

The College Board's Advanced Placement (AP) program consists of college-level courses and corresponding end-of-course examinations. Ninety percent of colleges and universities grant credit, placement, or both to students receiving a qualifying score on an AP exam (usually 3 or higher on a scale of 1 to 5 ). Many such schools grant up to a full year of college credit to students who earn a sufficient number of qualifying AP scores. Studies show that students who take AP courses and exams are more likely to succeed in college. Each AP course is developed by a committee of college faculty and AP teachers and has a corresponding exam that is administered in May of each year. Most AP exams contain multiple-choice questions and a freeresponse section (e.g., essay, problem solving, oral response).
In order to broaden program access, the College Board allows students to take AP exams whether they have completed the corresponding AP course or not. However, because the performance on AP exams following AP course completion reflects the effectiveness of the District's AP program, this briefing includes only exams taken in conjunction with an appropriate AP course and is thus limited to data from district-operated schools.

## AP Course Participation and Exam Performance

In 2007-2008, the College Board offered 37 courses/exams in 22 disciplines; the San Diego Unified School District offered 32 of these courses at its comprehensive high schools. ${ }^{1}$ The number of courses offered at each school ranged from 1 to 23, with 11 schools offering ten or more distinct AP courses (see below).


Student participation in the District's AP program has increased 7 percentage points over the past eight years in terms of those enrolled in at least one AP course and those who took at least one AP exam. For the last three years, the percent of AP exams passed by district students has been gradually increasing; the 2008 "exam pass rate" shows a 4 percentage-point increase compared with 2005.

In 2008, roughly 26 percent of Grade 10-12 students ( $\mathrm{n}=5,751$ ) were enrolled in at least one AP course; nearly half of these students (46 percent) took more than one AP course. These 5,751 students were enrolled in 9,671 AP courses. Ninety-three percent of these enrollments resulted in a completed AP exam, 49 percent of which received a passing score.



## Gaps in Subgroup Participation and Performance

Despite District efforts to broaden access to the AP curriculum, gaps remain. In 2007-08, while half of Grade 10-12 students were eligible for free or reduced-price meals, only 31 percent of those enrolled in AP courses had such status.

Similar gaps are found among the district's major ethnic groups. Hispanic students accounted for 40 percent of Grade 10-12 enrollment but represented only 24 percent of AP course enrollment; African-American students represented only 6 percent of AP course enrollment despite comprising 13 percent of enrollment. In terms of AP exam pass rates, Asian and White students had the highest rates with 64 and 59 percent, respectively; African American students had the lowest with 22 percent. AP exams taken by Hispanic students in 2008 had a mid-range pass rate at 40 percent.

## District Results Compared With California and Nation

The College Board reports AP participation as a percentage of graduates who have taken and passed an AP exam during their high school years. The District performed well in relation to both the state and the nation, with higher proportions of graduates taking and passing one or more AP exams during high school than their counterparts in the state and nationwide.
