

Principal's Statement

Instruction and Curriculum

The San Diego Unified School District has adopted the Common Core State Standards, which reflect the knowledge and skills that students need in order to be successful in college and careers. The standards require that students gain knowledge systematically through reading, writing, speaking, and listening. High standards that are consistent across states provide teachers, parents, and students with a set of clear expectations that are aligned to the expectations in college and careers.

The standards promote equity by ensuring all students, no matter where they live, are well prepared with the skills and knowledge necessary to collaborate and compete with their peers in the United States and abroad. A range of support opportunities is available for students needing additional assistance.

The school staff is focused on helping all students achieve success, particularly those students at risk of academic failure. For the 2013–14, we have established a Response to Intervention system to support students academically and to collect data to help us make good decision for students. We also will conduct Student Study Team meetings as part of this process to mobilize all of our resources on behalf of our students. Students are actively engaged in literacy and mathematics instruction that involves them in activities and lessons guided by the district's literacy and mathematics standards.

Opportunities for Parent Involvement

Parents and other relatives are encouraged and welcomed to become involved in the formal education of their children. Educational research validates that support at home is critical to a child's academic success. There are many opportunities to be involved at their children's school site, including: governance committees, special events, fundraising events, parent organizations, and in classrooms, and at the district level by participating in cluster councils, district advisory councils/committees, Parent University, and special events. Parents are encouraged to support their children at home by making their expectations about school clear and creating a positive learning environment at home.

At Hage Elementary we are committed to obtaining community resources for our school and invite all constituencies to assist us in the education of our students.

We committed to increasing community and parent involvement at Hage. We have active parent groups that support our school: our volunteer program, Parent Teacher Association, School Site Council (SSC), and Site Governance Team (SGT). The SSC monitors our school's Single Plan for Student Achievement, which outlines clearly how the site budget funds will be allocated to support students. All stakeholders are represented on the SSC and SGT.

Standardized Testing and Reporting Program Results

The Standardized Testing and Reporting (STAR) program was last administered in the 2012–13. It was superseded in January 2014 by the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP). Through the STAR program, students in grades 2–11 were tested annually in various subjects. The California Standards Tests (CST) included English language arts and mathematics (grades 2–11), science (grades 5, 8, and 9–11), and history–social science (grades 8 and 9–11).
